Understanding the Section 179 Deduction?

Section 179 of the IRS Code allows businesses to **deduct** the **full purchase price** of qualifying equipment and/or software purchased or financed from your gross income during the tax year. The Section 179 deduction for 2025 is \$1,250,000, with a "total equipment purchase" limit of \$3,130,000. The deduction includes both new and used qualified equipment.
